CELEBRATIONS!

I was considering this year of 2025. Do you realize I am in my 10th year serving here at Bethel Hill UMC? I arrived at the end of June, 2015. So many blessings about being here! I came alone because I left Gerry with our Frackville youth group at the Creation Festival in Mount Union, PA. It was a stressful time! I was worried about meeting all of you for the first time. I was wor-

ried my youth group would return safely to Frackville and get all the unpacking done. I was worried I'd get all MY unpacking done at the new-to-me parsonage at 2000 (now 2000A) Bethel Road. Considering everything, I was just plain worried!

Over the years I have shared with you that I am a champion worrier. I've also come to realize that 'worrying' is NOT one of the spiritual gifts Paul lists in Ephesians and Corinthians! And NONE of us should claim worrying as a gift! I think I've gotten better at that, but there are still certain things that cause me to lose sleep.

Another thing I've been considering is that in June 2025, it will be 17 years since my bone marrow transplant! Truthfully, I could be dead! I was in a transplant "class" with three other women. We went to the University of Pennsylvania to find out all that would be done to us, and all that could happen to us, and all the possible side effects. Out of us four women, one never made it to her transplant (she died), one had her disease re-occur within two years (she also died), the other was in the hospital the same time I was and wound up in ICU with complications. When I talked to her a couple of years post-transplant, she had not been able to return to work full-time and was still experiencing difficulties.

Yes, for me there are still lingering effects from the massive chemotherapy and the drugs administered to reduce rejection, but HEY – I'm still here & I'm CELEBRATING! I am just celebrating LIFE!

What are YOU celebrating? What can you look back on that you were worried about? Can you see how God walked you through it? Can you see how God never left your side? Can you remember the people who surrounded you to assist? Can you trust that God will have your back into the future? Celebrate the gift of life and give thanks for every day!




