A note from Pastor Sue

WHAT TO WEAR?

This has been a strange season weatherwise. Just as soon as we are sure we can pack the winter clothes away, we have to grab a sweater again and wear a jacket outside. And since I am always cold, that means I am wearing long sleeves more often than not!

The apostle Paul speaks quite frequently about clothing. There is the whole armor of God piece in Ephesians chapter 6, as

he describes outfitting yourself with different pieces of battle gear representing the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit. All while walking in shoes (or sandals!) fitted with the gospel of peace. These, as Paul describes, will help us stand firm in our faith and in our beliefs.

Paul then tells us in Colossians 3:27 that those of us who have been baptized have clothed themselves with Christ. What exactly does this mean? We can't physically put on the "jacket of Jesus" or the "coat of Christ." I think it means that we adopt the attitudes and practices of Jesus. That we live and move and breathe like Jesus. That we accept and help and heal like Jesus. That we LOVE like Jesus.

And then, as Paul tells us in Colossians 3:12, this is what we should put on every morning: "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience."

A tall order indeed! Let's think about that and as we are planning our outfit for the day, make sure it includes the characteristics of Jesus!

A big thank you to all who helped with this year's Chicken Bar-B-Q and Flea Market, the 61st anniversary of this church-wide fundraiser! There are too many volunteers to mentioned by name (and we don't want to forget anyone, but you all know who you are!) From those who helped unpack and arrange flea market treasures and collect donations during the sale, everyone who made brownies, or cooked potatoes and chopped onions, to those who helped cook chickens and deliver meals to cars, and all the other other tasks required to make the day a success, we couldn't have raised over \$4,300 without you! Many hands made light work, although the weather and some other factors did pose some challenges cooking the chickens this year. We ordered an extra case, 264 total chickens. Wind and some slow charcoal made for a long day at the pit. We pretty much had that extra case as leftovers, so we'll go back to the 2024 numbers for next year. We did still sell 459 meals and while Manna on Main Street appreciated the donation, it's better for everyone to not have too much leftover. April was a roller coaster month for me, opening with Cheri being hospitalized prior to the duplex build the first weekend of the month. Celebrated by the surgeon that was elated he had gotten it all. How do thank a congregation for blessing our family with prayers, love, cards and support through an unbelievable month and life.
